Who You Are:

You are a strong project manager with an eye for detail with experience leading best in class events. You are a skilled organizer and planner. Technology, data and process excite you. You thrive in a fast-paced, collaborative environment. You have excellent written and oral communication skills. You enjoy organizing groups of volunteers on event committees and on the day of the event. You are comfortable reaching out to donors to solicit auction packages, golf teams, and table chairpersons. You build great relationships with constituents.

The Events Manager reports to the GM/Regional Executive Director, PNW.

Essential Functions:

- Responsible for managing volunteers, event committee members, leadership council members, and board members.
- Working with the development team, secure silent and oral auction items, golf teams, and table chairs for special events.
- Take responsibility for vendor relationships which includes researching, selecting, and managing vendors. Manage internal event logistics including guest registration, data support, setup/tear down, and recap reports. Delegate aspects of event management to support staff.
- Track, document, and project manage oral and silent auction technology, platform and procurement.
- Lead and support the back-end technology setup and strategy development for peer-to-peer fundraising campaigns.



- Lead car raffle logistics including page set up, DOJ filings, reporting and recaps. Work with media partners to maximize raffle success.
- Ensure thorough stakeholder relationship information is entered into Raiser's Edge in a timely manner.
- Generate reports for event committees, the development team and track data to assist in assessing department efficacy.

Qualifications and Skills:

- Excellent people management skills
- Ability to manage complex events with multiple moving parts calmly and expertly
- Superior project management skills
- Outstanding planning, organizational, and analytical skills
- Strong expense management skills
- Proficiency in Microsoft Suite of products, particularly Excel, Word and Outlook required
- Sound judgment in problem-solving and decision-making techniques
- Strong written and verbal communication skills
- Self-starter with the ability to work independently and within a team
- Ability to meet deadlines in a fast-paced environment
- Able to balance competing priorities, complex situations, and tight deadlines

Education and Experience:

- 5+ years' working with events and/or peer to peer fundraising platforms.
- Experience with OneCause, MobileCause and Raiser's Edge, preferred.
- Nonprofit experience strongly preferred.

Work Environment:

At JoyRx we are committed to a work environment where each person feels a sense of belonging and they are recognized, appreciated, and valued.

This position is based in the JoyRx Portland, OR office. JoyRx offers a hybrid office environment, with both onsite (professional open office environment) days and the ability to work remotely up to two days/week (Mondays & Fridays).

Physical Demands:

The physical demands described here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of this job, with or without a reasonable accommodation.

Due to the nature of JoyRx's work with immunocompromised children, it is our responsibility to take every precaution possible to protect the health and safety of the children and families we serve. All JoyRx employees, regardless of work location, are required to receive COVID-19 vaccinations as recommended by the CDC, unless a reasonable accommodation is approved.

This position requires frequent operation of a computer and other office equipment, such as a calculator, copy machine, and computer printer. This position requires the ability to perform basic math and speak, hear, write, and read English. This is largely a sedentary role; however, some occasional lifting is required (up to 20 lbs).

Travel:

This position requires occasional travel in the Portland Metro or Austin Metro areas; there may be limited travel to other key regions.

Position Type/Expected Hours of Work:

This is a full time (40 hours/week) exempt position. Some flexibility in hours is allowed; days and hours of work are generally Monday through Thursday, 8:00 am – 5:30 pm and Friday 8:00 am – 12:00 pm. At times, this position requires evening hours and occasional weekend work.

Compensation and Benefits:

JoyRx is a growth organization that looks for team members to grow with it. JoyRx offers a generous total rewards package, a casual work environment, and an inclusive culture.

This position offers a competitive benefits package and a salary range starting at \$53,000/year. Final offer amounts and levels are determined by multiple factors, including your experience, and may vary from the amounts listed above.
